We are looking for an outstanding person to join the [European Alliance Against Depression \(EAAD\)](https://www.eaad.net) in the position of Project Manager.

EAAD is an international non-profit organization based in Leipzig and Frankfurt am Main, Germany. We work with our global network to improve care and optimise treatment for patients with depressive disorders and to prevent suicidal behaviour.

Led by our President, Professor Dr. Ulrich Hegerl, EAAD boasts an [international network](#) of 20 partners and over 120 regional network partners, from across Europe and beyond to Canada, Chile, New Zealand and Australia.

EAAD's objectives are embedded in evidence-based research – focusing on community based interventions.
